DIFFERENT TYPES OF PRINTER'S



Ink Printer

Inkjet printers use tiny nozzles to spray pigment-based ink onto paper, producing high-quality images. They are slower than laser printers and hold less paper, but excel in blending colors. Dye-based ink is best for photos but is more expensive than laser toner. Inkjets are great for high-quality prints.



Laser Printer

For heavy usage, a laser printer is recommended. It uses light to transfer toner onto paper, resulting in crisp and smudge-free prints. There are monochrome (black ink) and color options, but color printers are more expensive. Laser printers are great for high-volume printing and produce pages faster than inkjet printers.



All in One Printer

An all-in-one printer combines a printer, scanner, copier, and fax machine in one device. It can scan to the cloud and have Wi-Fi capabilities. Inkjet models are famous for households, while laser versions are more common in businesses. They vary in functionality and are versatile for combining multiple functions into one device.



Photo Printer

Dedicated photo printers are great for professionals and designers. They're compact and have card slots for direct printing from cameras. Some models let you print wirelessly from phones or tablets. Most have LCD screens and options for editing. Prints usually default to 4x6 inches, but some models offer adjustable sizes. Printing technologies include dye, pigment-based inks, and thermal colour printing.

EVALUATING PRINT SPEED AND QUALITY

Printing Speed

It is common to find several print speeds listed for a printer, as the rate may differ depending on the page size and whether the pages are in colour. When looking at print speeds, you may come across the abbreviation PPM, which stands for pages per minute. While this specification is less critical for home use, it holds greater significance for businesses.

Print Resolution

When shopping for printers, resolution can be a tricky specification to understand. Unlike with displays or other technology, printer resolution is measured in dots per inch (DPI). You'll see pairs of numbers, like 1200 x 1200 or 4800 x 1200. A general rule to remember is that as the resolution increases, so does the clarity of the printed materials.

SINGLE FUNCTION



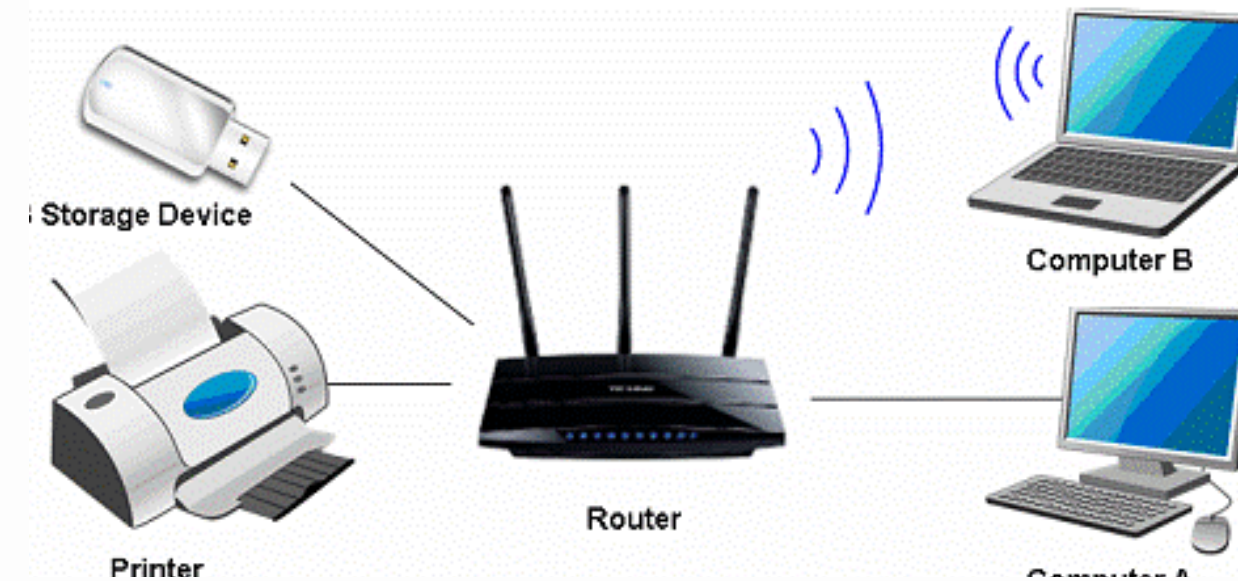
- 01** A printer that only offers printing functionality is known as a single-function printer. This type of printer has several advantages, such as lower cost at checkout and over time, faster printing speeds, and a slimmer profile. Single-function printers are ideal for those who outsource their larger print jobs and offices requiring heavy document printing but use other devices for scanning and copying.

MULTIFUNCTION

- 02** Multifunction printers are incredibly versatile devices that offer a wide range of features. With the ability to scan, copy, and print all from one device, they are an excellent choice for those who need to handle multiple tasks efficiently. Some models offer specialized photo support and fax options, making them an even more helpful tool for your home or office.



CONNECTIVITY



USB

To connect a USB printer to your computer, simply use a USB cable.

Wifi

Wireless printers are an excellent solution for offices and households, allowing for easy access from multiple devices. It's recommended to look for printers with wireless connectivity up to 802.11n to ensure seamless printing.

Ethernet

Network printers connect to a router and Ethernet cable. Your computer needs to be on the same network to use them. They're great for offices since multiple staff can share them. Get a USB printer with Ethernet capabilities.

Mobile Printing

Mobile printers offer wireless printing from mobile devices and cloud services. Air Print for iOS and Google Cloud Print for Android and iOS are available, as well as printer-specific apps.

ADDITIONAL FEATURE'S

- 01 Paper Handling** - Printers typically have a maximum paper size of 8.5" x 11" (Letter Size), so if you require the ability to print on legal-size paper (11" x 17"), you will need to search for a printer model that can accommodate this larger size.
- 02 Duplex printing** - Printing on both sides of the paper, also known as automatic duplex printing, helps to save more paper.
- 03 ADF** - Automatic document feeder or ADF is a feature which takes several pages and feeds the paper one page at a time into a scanner or copier, allowing the user to scan and thereby copy, print, or fax, multiple-page documents without having to manually replace each page.
- 04 USB front Drive Port** -.Having a printer with a front-facing USB flash drive port is convenient. This port enables users to print and scan directly from the printer control panel without a PC.
- 05 size and Ease in Installation** - Consider the printer's size and available space. A compact option may be better. Also, check how easy it is to install toner and paper.
